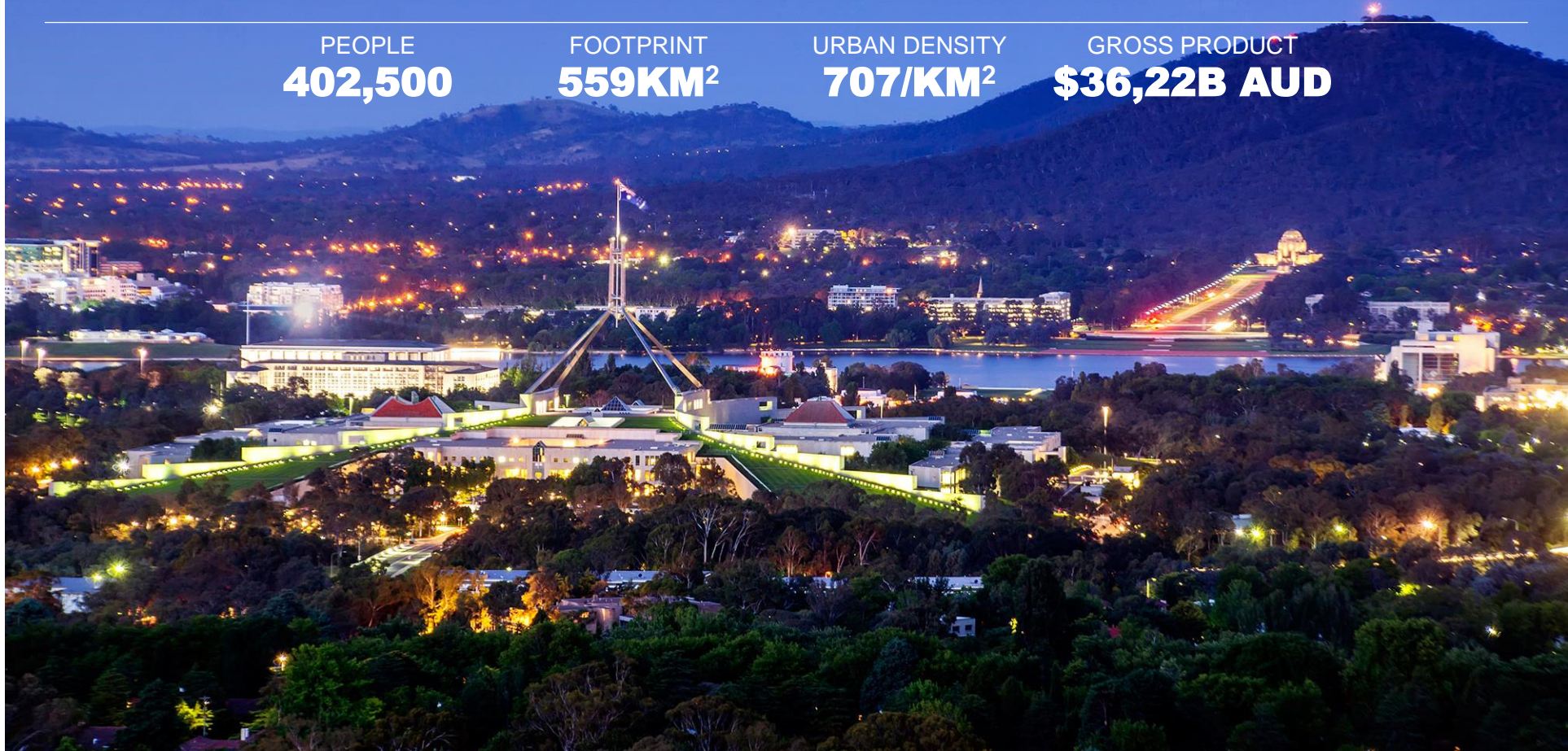

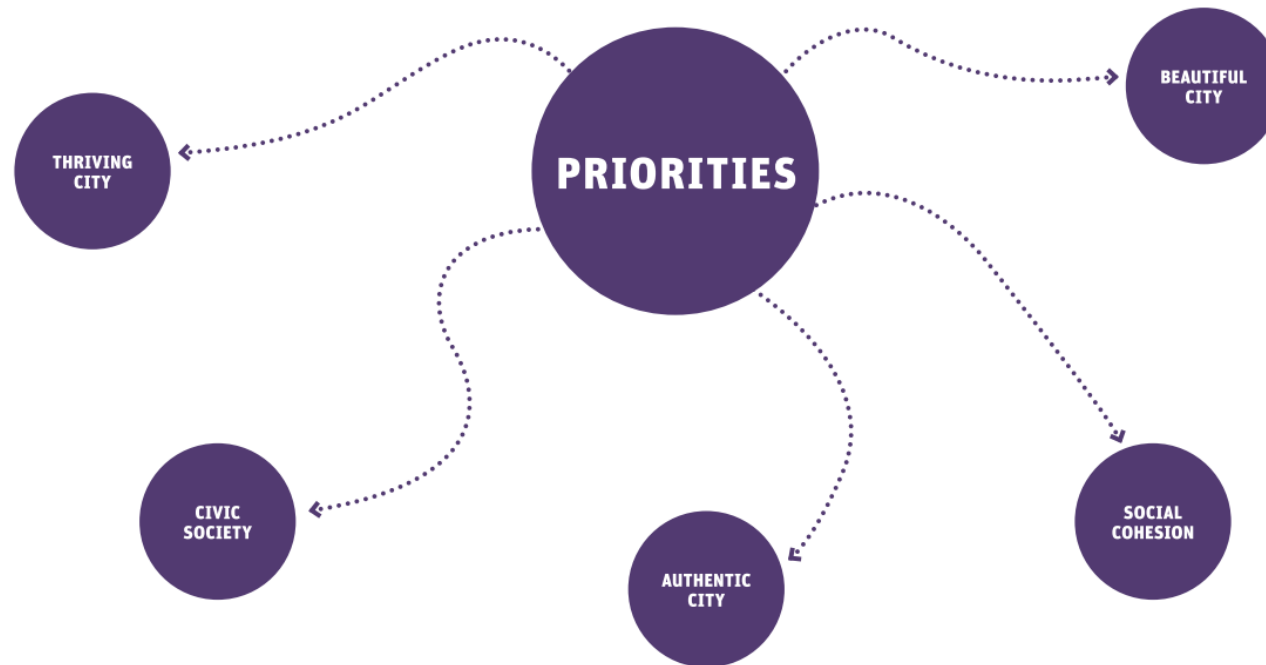

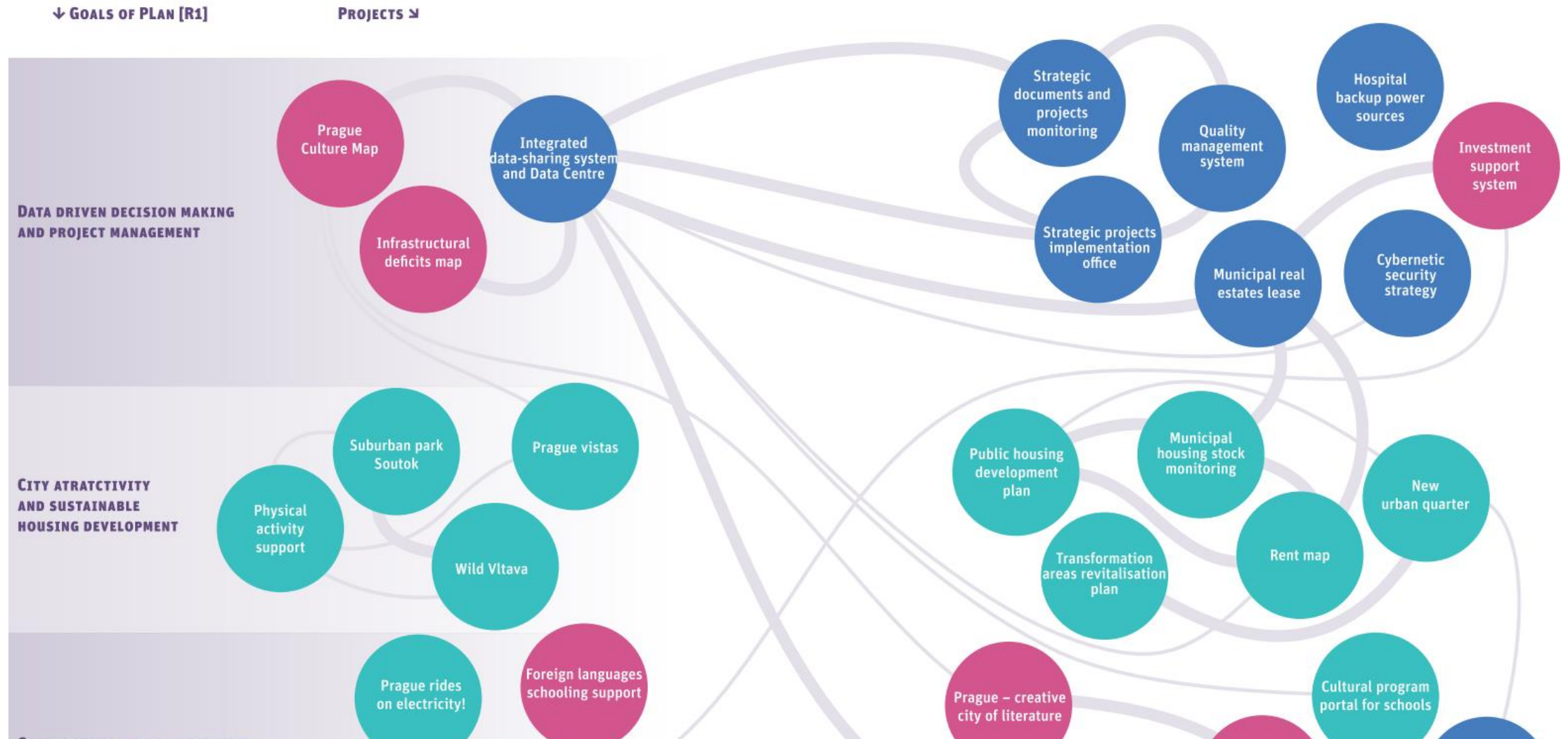

Bilateral Collaboration: Next Steps

Signed MoU on innovation (2017) to be enlarged to include more topics and concrete steps:

- Innovation through the promotion of start-ups and joint activities between their incubators and accelerators in areas relevant to urban development. TRIPLE HELIX approach with CBRIN & PSC.
- Maximising the opportunities of brownfield development whilst retaining the past industries. Urban renewal - retrofitting.
- District development strategies that address climate change and management of social change (affordable housing).
