European Union and the Republic of Korea: strategic partners

- Deep cooperation exists in political, economic/trade and security terms: the Framework Agreement; the Free Trade Agreement; the Framework Participation Agreement
- The Free Trade Agreement remains the most ambitious trade deal so far implemented. EU-Korea bilateral trade worth some 86 billion euros
- The framework agreed on a global with the adoption of the New Urban Agenda under Habitat 3 in Quito in 2016 provides a new context for EU-Korea cooperation on sustainable urban development

The EU's World Cities project: Objectives

- To establish city pairings, EU with non-EU, for cities interested in promoting more sustainable urban development (approximately 16 + 16 = 32) in accordance with the EU Urban Agenda and the New Urban Agenda of the United Nations
- To facilitate the exchange of information and good practices on urban development policy and practice in accordance with the EU Urban Agenda and the New Urban Agenda
- To identify pilot and concrete actions, for implementation in the short-term, in diverse areas including urban innovation (smart-city), green technologies (energy, low carbon) and circular economy (waste and water management).



World Cities: Objectives

- To provide technical assistance using a specialist team also including the EU Delegations in non-EU countries, national authorities of the non-EU countries, REGIO.
- To promote multi-stakeholder approaches, notably, the socalled 'triple-helix cooperation' between governments, research and business
- To strengthen market opportunities and job creation while pursuing the sustainable economic development of the cities involved, thus fostering win-win cooperation.

World Cities II – Non-EU cities

- Cooperation of EU cities with cities from Australia, South Africa, South Korea, Indonesia and Vietnam since March/June 2017
- Seoul, Busan, Gwangju, Suwon in South Korea are part of a selected group of non-EU cities, working in 16 city pairs also including
 - South Africa: Cape Town, Durban, Port Elisabeth, Ekurhuleni
 - **Australia: Canberra, Melbourne, Adelaide and Hobart**
 - Indonesia: Semarang, Makassar
 - Vietnam: Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC), Hanoi

World Cities II implementation: main phases with Korea (1)

- Selection of EU and Korean cities for implementing pairing schemes during 2017–2018 [$\sqrt{$]
 - Open competition in the EU and Korea
- First meeting: plenary session [√] followed by one-week working meetings in the non-EU country (five delegates from each participating EU city).
 - Objective: obtain agreement in principle to cooperate on a limited number of urban development themes of shared interest. The working meetings broke out to include field and projects visits in the paired city.
- Time period: March 2017

World Cities II implementation: main phases (2)


- Period of bilateral cooperation among the cities on the agreed themes
 - Coordination calls between both sides
 - Support through the pairing managers
 - Adjusting topics based on the feasibility of the proposals
- Second working meetings in the European Union happened in November 2017
 - The project covered delegations from each Korean city to visit their city pairs and to participate at mid-term review conference in Copenhagen at Ramboll Headquarters.

World Cities II implementation: main phases (3)

- Project finale: Closing meetings just held in Korea.
 - Objective: stocktaking plus plans for further cooperation outside the World Cities project (possibilities include MoUs, Letters of Intent, joint pilot projects, exchange of personnel, etc).
 - Time: 18 19 March 2018
 - Tampere visited Gwangju already early March (due to time constrains for this week)
 - Eindhoven postponed visit to June 2018
 - Results:
 - Roadmaps for collaboration (partly LoIs under preparation)
 - Involvement of partners from public authorities, universities, business community and the civil society (*quadruple-helix*)
 - Vast portfolio of pilot projects (see next slides)



World Cities: Pilot Areas For Cooperation (1)

- 1) Seoul Eindhoven (MoU under preparation)
 - Urban lighting: cooperation on Smart Urban Lighting Systems
 industry involved
 - ✓ Social Innovation: establishing the first joint "Global Living Lab" addressing key societal challenges through innovation
 - E-Government: exchange of policies and technologies towards global digital transition to improve governing processes and facilitate all urban actors, and in particular our citizens
 - ✓ Joint participation in Horizon 2020 calls related to Smart City, Clean Energy, Urban Mobility



World Cities: Pilot Areas For Cooperation (2)

- 2) Gwangju Tampere (MoU under preparation)
 - ✓ Mobility: Mobility as a Service (MaaS), Mobility HUBs and Emobility: Gwangju plans to build a cluster for making ecofriendly vehicle parts. Cooperation with LG Innotek.
 - ✓ Smart City: Cooperation on ICT standards Gwangju to join the Open and Agile Smart Cities Alliance.
 - ✓ Virtual reality and artificial intelligence: Cooperation between Tampere's TAUCHI Human-Machine Interface Program and Gwangju Techno Park 3D, GIST Gwangju Institute of Science and Technology.
 - ✓ Air Quality



World Cities: Pilot Areas For Cooperation (3)

3) Busan – Barcelona (LoI under preparation)

- ✓ Smart-city: Possible Smart Cities Expo in Busan 2018
- ✓ Urban mobility: Busan to learn from Barcelona's public transportation integrated fare system
- ✓ Joint participation in Horizon 2020 calls related to Smart City, Clean Energy, Urban Mobility
- ✓ Urban regeneration: join development of cultural concepts for brownfield sites
- ✓ Start-ups ecosystems of Barcelona and Busan





World Cities: Pilot Areas For Cooperation (4)

- 4) Suwon Scottish Cities (MoI under preparation)
- ✓ Cultural heritage: cooperation between Historic Environment Scotland (including *The Engine Shed*) and Suwon's Hwaseong Fortress, a UNESCO World DataHeritage Site. Tools used for analysis and the work of the digital team (3D work, etc.)
- ✓ Urban Regeneration cooperation with Clyde Gateway (Scotland's biggest and most ambitious regeneration programme).

Possible further areas:


- \checkmark Big data: cooperation between The Lab and Suwon's
